FROM THE CEO: THERE IS SOMETHING ABOUT LISTENING...

As I enter my 5th month of employment with Hope Haven, I recognize I have spent a lot of time listening to staff, colleagues, board members, community members, etc. with the purpose to first seek to understand (the 5th Habit for Highly Effective People by Franklin Covey.) Understanding the importance of trying to have a clear understanding of their wants, needs, and goals for our organization and the community.

I reflect on how often we are in conversation and our minds wonder off or start to think about how to “help” or “fix” what is bothering the person speaking. It reminds me of a poem that I value and have tried to follow by Leo Buscaglia about listening. Buscaglia was a special education professor and an author. He wrote about loving and human relationships. In a poem he writes, Please Listen:

“When I ask you to listen to me and you start giving me advice,
You have not done what I asked.
When I ask you to listen to me and you begin to tell me why I
Should not feel that way, you are trampling on my feelings.
When I ask you to listen to me and you feel you must do something
to solve my problem, you have failed me, strange as that may seem. ...”

The poem goes on and says to not just listen but hear what the person is saying and do not always think you need to respond, but more importantly to be present.

Sometimes in the world of human services we try to fix things when what we really are intending to do is assist others to live the life they choose to live. Most often, this means taking a step back and helping with problem solving and utilizing reflective listening to make sure you are hearing and fully understanding what the person is telling you. It is not our role to “fix,” but to assist individuals to acquire the tools they need to thrive and be as successful as possible.

I challenge us all to consider the words of Buscaglia as there is something about listening.

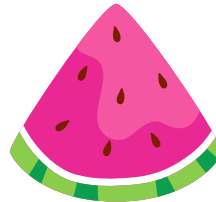

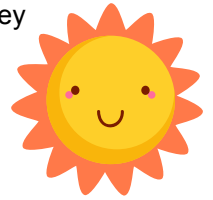
